
Connecticut State ARML Team 2019

Congratulations...

on being accepted to participate on the Connecticut State Math Team for American Regions Math League (ARML) Meet to be held this year at:

> Penn State University on Friday, May 31 and Saturday, June 1. We will return to Connecticut on Sunday, June 2.

This is a fantastic opportunity to compete and share experiences with some of the country's most outstanding math students and also give favorable publicity for you, your school and your community.

The trip is not just socializing. There is much preparation. Topics include analytic geometry, number theory, inequalities, logarithms, probability, progressions, trigonometry, etc. If you are weak in any of these areas, your math teacher will be glad to assist you or find a reference book for you. You could also visit the arml.com web page and look at competitions from previous years.

Online Information

The preparation to be done is to solve and analyze the problems given to you from past ARML contests. If you do not intend to prepare, then give one of the alternates the opportunity to join the team.

Registration and Permission

You will receive an email inviting you to join the team. Please let us know immediately by responding to that email whether you plan on accepting this invitation. If you need time to decide please let us know this by responding to the email, and then follow up with your decision within seven days (that is, by <u>Thursday, April 11th</u>).

All participants must bring a signed Student Permission Form to the first team practice on May 11th.

Afterwards, if for any important reason you discover that you will be unable to come to Penn State on May 31st, please let Mr. Allwood know immediately. Please do not leave this until the last moment as this lets down your fellow team members and adversely affects the performance of the team.

Fees and Other Expenses

The cost of the trip is **\$250** per person. *The fee has traditionally been absorbed by the individual's school.* If your school will pay for your fee, it's very important that you give the attached invoice to your math team advisor <u>now</u> so that he/she can get the money for you.

The money sent for the trip covers transportation, housing on Friday and Saturday nights and breakfast and lunch on Saturday.

Additionally, please bring money with you on the trip for <u>five</u> further meals:

- Friday breakfast (McDonalds)
- Friday lunch (A&W burgers / Arbys / Long John Silver)
- Friday dinner (with at least one other team member in the town of Penn State College)
- Saturday dinner (Hoss' Steakhouse)
- Sunday breakfast (Cracker Barrel)

Travel Information

Pick-up Locations: May 31, 2019

Stop #1 8:00 am Rocky Hill

Rocky Hill High School

The bus will park by the front tennis courts.

Stop #28:45 amWest HavenBest Western Executive Hotel. Exit 42 off I-95 in West Haven

The bus will park in the back by the front (main) entrance.

Stop #3 9:45 am Darien

McDonald's Rest Area between exits 10 and 9 on I-95(S) in Darien. McDonalds are located on both sides of I-95. Be at the one on the highway heading southbound. *Gather in the food/services building and we'll proceed to the bus from there when it arrives.*

Times are subject to prompt departure and no delays on route. Please remain at your pickup point in case of a delay. Please be at your pickup point one half hour before the scheduled departure time.

Drop-off Locations: June 2nd, 2019

On the return trip Sunday, June 2, we will stop at the same locations as those given above. All highway stops will now be at the rest stops located on the <u>northbound side of I-95</u>.
